1. Introduction

Project Title: Geriatrics Programme at Basirhat Municipality

This project mainly aims at improving the old age care and services through equipping 22 CDS women members through para-nurse technical training on old age medical care and support and setting up of a call center on old age care at the Municipality level.

Objectives of the project:

- ✓ Socio-economic empowerment of 22 CDS women
- ✓ Better old age care and service delivery within the specified wards
- ✓ Setting up of a call center on old age care at the Municipality level to cater to the 60+ old age people for home-based support.

Rationale of the baseline survey:

The CDS No. 1 of Basirhat Municipality is implementing a project on health & livelihood at Basirhat through 22 CDS members. The project is funded by KUSP/DFID being supervised by ICF. The current baseline survey is an effort to identify the number of people above 61 years within the 22 wards of the Municipality. This magnitude of the indicators at the baseline will help to understand effectiveness of the programme at the end line.

2. Methods

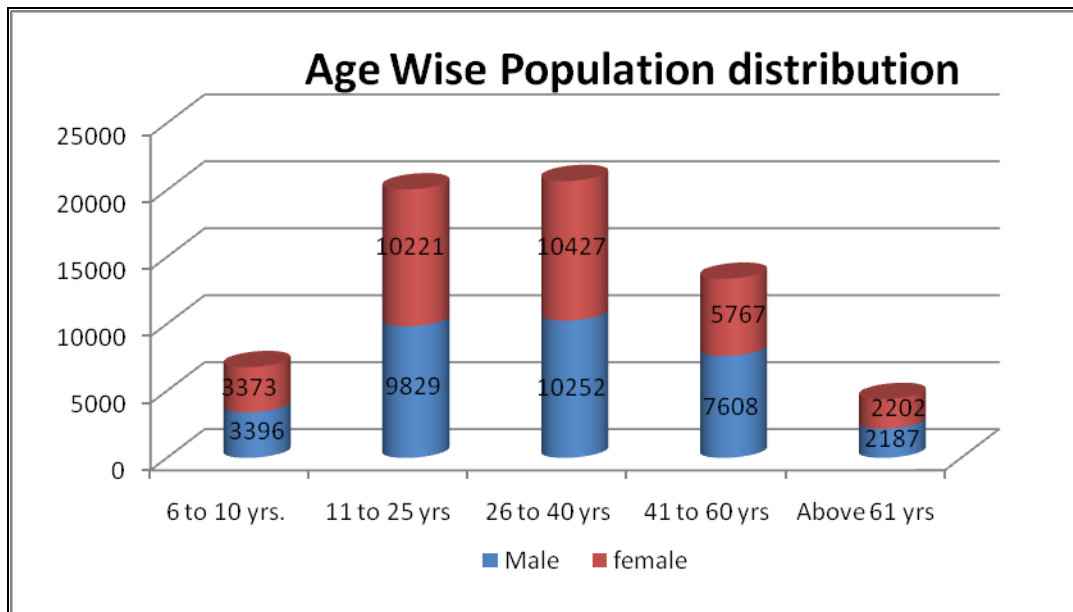

The major findings of the survey are analyzed below through tables and/or charts to access the current situation.

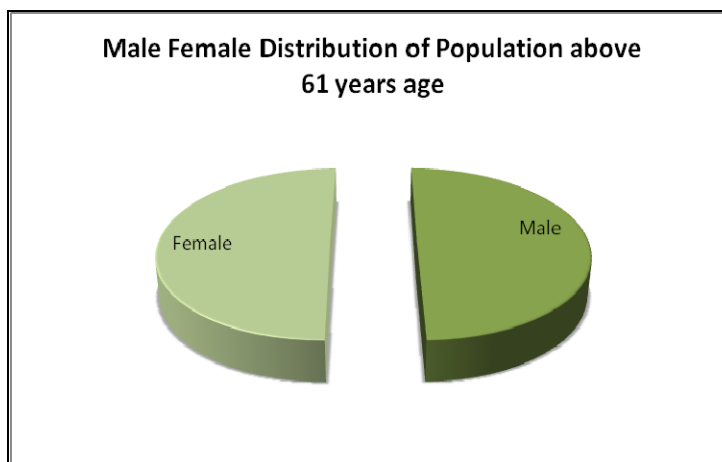
a. Age wise Population Distribution of the Municipality

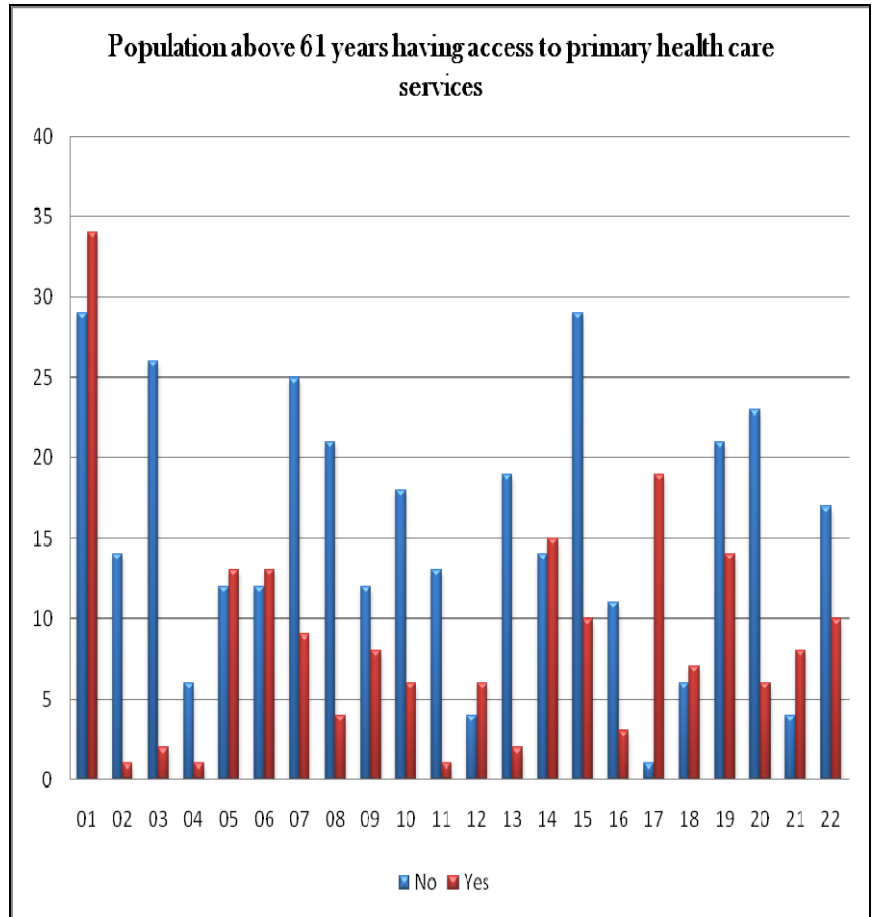

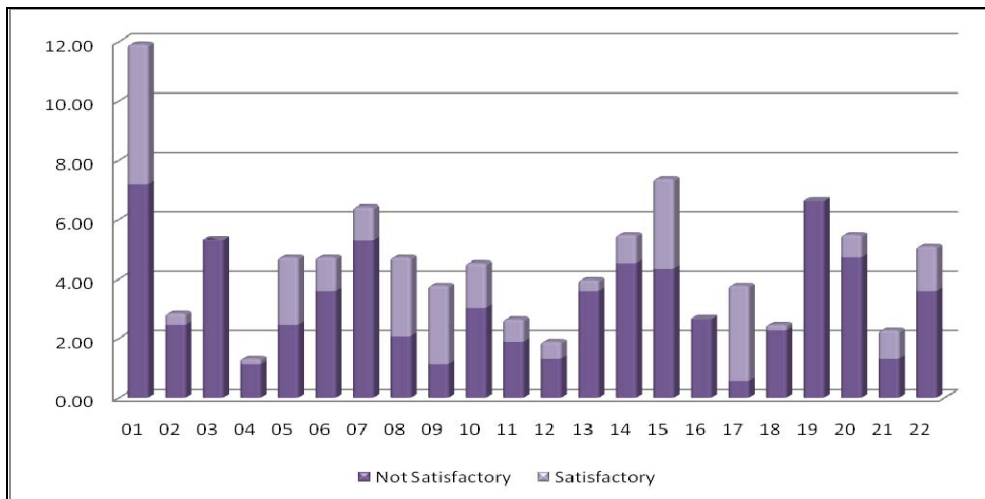
